A unique opportunity to own a piece of Maine history, a one of a kind cottage which is one of several original structures which were part of the Lakewood Theater colony on the shores of Lake Wassarunsett in the lush birch forest near Skowhegan. Built in 1900, this cottage has been renovated and added to several times over the past century but still maintains its original rustic charm both inside and out. Local legend has it that this cottage was once a dance hall and speakeasy, an after-hours get away for the endless list of celebrities who got their Broadway and Silver Screen start on the stage at the nearby Lakewood Theater only a short walk away.

Situated on the hillside overlooking the lake, the huge glassed in sun porch and the two elevated bedrooms provide a spectacular view of the surrounding areas including the theater and the lake. The large attached dance hall structure which once was home to the party-goers still features the close-fitted diagonal birch dance floor with a private stable below. The large, well-landscaped courtyard is fenced, while there is a cozy parking garage below the structure itself. The natural river-washed round stones for the rustic stonework at the front of the lot were gathered from the nearby stream and set in place by loving hands many years ago and provide a character to the property that cannot be duplicated today.

The large antique stove in the kitchen conveys with the property as do all the other appliances. The morning sun streams into the front sun porch to greet the day, while the sunsets are magnificent over the lake from the same porch venue. But the real charm is the closeness to nature that this cottage brings, especially to the loons who plaintively call to each other every summer evening.
